

of Knoxville, Iowa (where my coal mining roots grow very deep), it just made good sense to find out everything I could about what events took place underground, and where, in Iowa. Besides three generations of my family being in coal mining, I've read every book about coal I could get my hands on, interviewed coal miners and their sons, studied maps, collected over 400 old black and white pictures of coal mines, miners, miners' families and coal camp houses, and have walked hundreds of miles following old railroad spurs to mine sites where I take

pictures and video anything that's left to see!"

"I do enjoy so much giving talks about coal mining in Iowa and sharing the information I've collected about mining tools, mining artifacts and my collection of pictures!"

"It is immensely important to me that the 100 year history of Iowa coal mining not be lost or gather dust! I feel if I do not keep this history alive, in another generation, it all will be lost."

Sandy Vitolo, granddaughter of the late Earl Gaughenbaugh, donated a collection of photos and artifacts to us, which we will feature prominently during our upcoming Criminal History Day. Earl was Sheriff during one of the most active times during our county's past. Prohibition, the Ku Klux Klan, and coal miners strikes were the issues that Earl had to deal with, and did so in grand style. He eventually became a special



agent for the state, tracking down moonshiners and confiscating their equipment.

Another unique piece that was donated to the museum was a 1920's era mimeograph machine. We thank Mike Knowles for this fine piece of history!

Review of Fall 2005 Events

This past October, our second cemetery tour was held with a Halloween theme, called the 'Haunted History Tour'. Over 100 people took the luminary pathway to the gravesites of Governor Drake, Susannah McKee, Jonathon Stratton and other noteworthy residents to hear their life stories recounted by local historians beneath the glow of lanterns.

The tour began at the historic chapel that graces the grounds of Oakland Cemetery,

then over 1000 luminaries guided the guests from one grave to the next, beneath the light of the moon. The atmosphere was eerie and the story-telling was wonderful.

On November 11 & 12, 2005 an Historic

Coal Mining History in Appanoose County

Coal Mining historian Doug Wilson will present a program about the history of coal mining in Appanoose County and the surrounding area. This event will also be the annual meeting and election of officers for the Appanoose County Historical Society.

Criminal History Day at the Old County Jail

June 17 from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm at the Old County Jail & Sheriff's Residence on North Main in Centerville

This one-of-a-kind event will be the kick-off to fund-raising efforts to repair and renovate the old Appanoose County Jail with attached Sheriff's residence - one of only three left in the state of it's kind. This event will explore the seedier side of Appanoose County's past, and will uncover many stories of the darker side of the county. Events include:
