
## Appanoose County Hits the Shelves

### Appanoose County's New Freedom Rock features F.M. Drake

Artist Ray "Bubba" Sorenson has made a name for himself in the state of Iowa. Thousands of people make the trek to his home near Greenfield, Iowa, to see The Freedom



Rock, a 12-ft. high boulder that he paints every year with a scene to honor those who serve our county.

Sorenson is now painting Freedom Rocks in other Iowa counties, and Appanoose County was fortunate to host him duing August



while he painted a boulder on the southeast corner of the courthouse lawn.



A grand picture of General Francis Marion Drake, Appanoose County's most illustrious leader, adorns the face of the boulder. Also featured is the first U.S.S. Iowa, which Drake's daughter, Mary Lord Drake, christened.

The back side of the rock features

a pic-

ture of the east side of the square and a soldier hugging his small daughter. An emblem recognizing all branches of the military is included, and the top of the rock is draped in an American flag.

What a beautiful (and historic!) addition to the Centerville Square!

How Trivia Night works:

  - At the end of the night, the winning team will receive the Traveling Trivia Trophy and \$150 that they can split amongst their team members. The 2nd place team will receive \$75.
