

By vote of the members of the senior class, Judi Sharp and Sid Bradley were chosen Queen and King of the Prom.



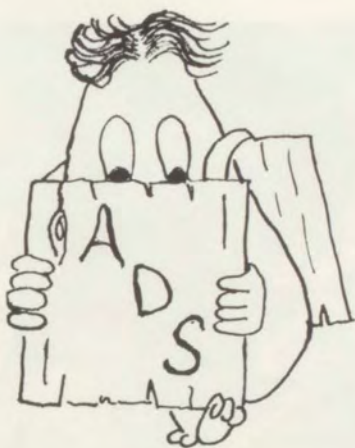
